

Joining our Sixth Form is an important step in extending your learning, broadening your horizons and preparing you for university or future employment.

If you apply to our Sixth Form, you will be invited to attend an interview. At this meeting we talk about the courses you would like to take so that your options are clear to you before you start. We can also help if you are unsure of the courses you think may suit you best. Once you have been offered a place in the Sixth Form, you have the opportunity to attend a taster session, to give you an idea of the sort of teaching and learning that takes place here.

The criteria for admission into our Sixth Form varies according to which subjects you wish to study and the level you wish to study at. For L3 courses you will need to achieve at least 5 GCSE grades 9 to 5 including English and Maths. For some A level courses it is preferable that you achieve a minimum of a 6 grade at GCSE in that subject. Some subjects require a grade 7. You will also need to provide us with an academic reference from your current school.

Lambeth Academy Sixth Form is committed to creating an atmosphere of mutual respect and shared values in which effective learning can take place and where all students can flourish.

We value our Sixth Form students and welcome them as part of the leadership of the school. They provide our younger students with excellent role models and we will encourage you to get as involved as you can in the life of the school. Sixth Form prefects are instrumental in representing the school at events and Sixth Form mentors support students in the lower years.

What we ask of you

If you get an offer of a place in our Sixth Form, we have the following expectations of you:

We expect

- A minimum of 95% attendance and punctuality to all lessons
- That all work is produced by the required deadline and to your highest standard
- Respect for all students, staff and the school environment
- At least 15 hours per week independent study on assigned work, in addition to background reading and extra study needed for topics causing particular difficulties
- You adhere to the Sixth Form Dress Code and wear your ID badge visibly at all times

Entering the Sixth Form offers students a new and exciting challenge. The work that you are required to do means that you will need to be self-motivated and organised. It also offers new intellectual challenges and your teachers will support and help you along the way. This requires you in return to work hard and engage with your subject teachers at all times.

General information for parents and students

Attendance

You will start lessons at 9.00am and are expected to arrive in school between 8.15-8.25am. Good attendance is critical to a successful time in our Sixth Form. Your attendance and punctuality data is available for universities and prospective employers, so it is vital that you are committed to being here every day on time.

You will attend daily tutorial sessions from 8.30am to 9am and 3pm to 3.15pm.



Dress code

You are required to wear smart dress. For male students this includes a shirt and tie, trousers and smart shoes. For female students a smart top, trousers or skirt and smart shoes. This reflects the ethos of our Sixth Form as a productive learning environment and prepares students for how they will be expected to present themselves in the work place.

Reports, reviews and resources

We provide report cards at the end of each term and an annual parents' meeting when you can discuss your progress in detail with subject teachers. Teachers are available by email and will happily respond to enquiries at other times.

You will be expected to attend academic review days, drop days and co-curricular conferences as required (e.g. UCAS information sessions).

As well as the LRC and the Russell Room we have other dedicated work spaces to enable you to make productive use of non-contact periods during the school day.

Applications to university and college

UCAS is the University and College Admission System and it is the only way to apply to university.

Students complete the application form on-line and it contains personal information (including GCSE results), a personal statement, an academic school reference, and the five choices of university that you have made.

The deadline for applications is January 15th of Year 13, but we encourage you to get your application in as soon as possible in the autumn term. Oxbridge applications must be submitted by October 15th.

All Year 13 students apply to at least one high-tariff university and receive personalised support and feedback on their application to maximise their chances of success. Our 2017 alumni have taken places at a wide range of exceptional universities including UCL, Kings College, University of Birmingham, University of Leeds and University of Southampton.



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
