
We learnt during Cultural Diversity Week that we live, work and attend school in a multicultural society.

Year 9 Belgium and France Trip

Last week, Year 9 students went on a two-day residential trip to Belgium and France to visit memorials about World War One.

Day one started off with us exploring Belgium, in the morning we visited the Lijssenthoek Commonwealth War Graves Commission Cemetery where we recalled the MAIN causes of WW1. The rest of the day included a visit to Bayernwald German Trench System and Hooge Crater Museum. We ended the day with some Belgian chocolate shopping in Ypres and taking part in the Menin Gate remembrance ceremony, before our overnight stay at Flanders Lodge. My favourite part was the visit to Hooge Museum as we explored the weapons and uniform of a Private and how they attempted to protect themselves through gas attacks. - Nadiya 9A.

On day 2 we travelled into Northern France and explored the French Market city of Lille. We then visited Faubourg d'Amiens and Vimy Ridge which was a memorial and a battlefield which today represents the success of the Battle of Arras in April 1917.
